

Information for NEHS Junior and Senior Parents/Students

4J Work Study Positions Available

North Region schools and several departments at the 4J School District office have work study positions available for students for the 2016/2017 school year. These positions are for the entire school year. Students must be able to work 1.75 to 3.0 hours a day (after 1:00 p.m. daily) for student attendance days only. Students earn \$9.75 an hour plus .5 elective credits every trimester. If interested in applying, students are asked to turn in a resume to Catherine Moran in the Career and College Center (located in room 209) after September 1, 2016.

ASPIRE Program

We encourage students to sign up for the free ASPIRE program through our ASPIRE Coordinator, Ann Christianson, after Sept. 1, 2016. ASPIRE mentors are trained and eager to meet with students one-on-one in the Career and College Center to help them learn all about post high school education opportunities, college placement testing, scholarships, as well as, financial aid to help them realize their career dreams and goals (parent letter and sign up form are included in the back to school mailing).

Work Experience Credit

Are you a student who is currently working or has been working? If so, you are eligible to earn .5 elective credits for every 135 hours you work within a twelve-week trimester. Please turn in documentation that shows the dates worked and number of hours worked (pay stubs or a letter showing the number of hours worked during a particular period of time) to Catherine Moran in the Career and College Center in room 209 after September 1, 2016.

Scholarships and Financial Aid

Parents and students are encouraged to visit the Career and College Center in room 209 to learn more about scholarships and financial aid for students. The scholarship board and list is updated weekly throughout the school year as well as posted weekly on the NEHS website under the Resources link.

PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT

ASPIRE is a volunteer mentoring program that assists high school students in the process of accessing training and education beyond high school. Working one-on-one, trained ASPIRE volunteer advisors help students with career and school research, applications and admissions processes, and provide information on financial aid. ASPIRE volunteer advisors must pass a criminal records check before meeting with students. Meetings take place at school, with staff present, throughout the school year. Participation does not guarantee that students will receive scholarships.

Each year students are asked to complete a confidential online survey about their experience and future plans. For students under the age of 18, participation in ASPIRE and the survey require a parent or guardian signature below.

Participation in all ASPIRE programs and the program evaluation is voluntary and confidential. You are free to withdraw your consent and discontinue participation at any time.
